LI Nan

LI Nan is a senior research fellow at the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences' Institute of American Studies. His research mainly focuses on U.S-North Korea relations and China-North Korea relations. Dr. Li has been a visiting Scholar at Seoul National University (2014-2015), Brookings Institution (2012), Johns Hopkins SAIS (2011-2012), and Arizona State University (2004-2005) and frequently visited the Korean Academy of Social Sciences and Kim II Sung University (DPRK). Previously, he was the chairman of the Academic Committee, as well as the director of the Research Department of China Foundation for International and Strategic Studies, deputy defense attaché at the Chinese Embassy in the UK, a research fellow in the Institute of Strategic Studies of People's Liberation Army (PLA) National Defense University and a lecturer at the PLA Military Collage. His main research interests are China-US relations, China-Japan relations, Asia-Pacific security, security crisis management and China's foreign policy. He has authored or co-authored lots of research publications including papers, policy reports and books. He earned his master's degree from Central Party School of the Communist Party of China.

Georgy TOLORAYA

Georgy Toloraya is the Director of Asian strategy center at the Institute of Economics of Russian Academy of Sciences. He was previously a member of the Panel of Experts assisting the UN Security Council Sanctions Committee on the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) from 2019 to 2024. He also holds a professorship at Moscow State Institute of International Relations (MGIMO). Prof. Toloraya previously served as a diplomat, including two postings in DPRK (1977-80 and 1984-87), in Republic of Korea (1993-98), in Moscow as Deputy Director-General handling the Korean Peninsula (1998-2003), and as a Consul-General of the Russian Federation in Sydney, Australia (2003-2006). Prof. Toloraya holds a Ph.D. in economics and a Full Professor degree in Oriental studies. He served as a visiting fellow at Brookings.

Alexander VORONTSOV

Alexander Vorontsov is currently the head of the Department for Korean and Mongolian Studies at the Institute of Oriental Studies of the Russia Academy of Sciences. He also holds post as Russian Military Science Academy Professor. He repeatedly takes part in Track 1.5 and Track 2 conferences dealing with the security situation on the Korean Peninsula and East Asia. He was a visiting fellow at the Brookings Institution Center for Northeast Asian Policy Studies in Washington D.C. in 2005-2006, graduated from Asia Pacific-Center for Security Studies Executive Courses in Honolulu in 2005. Dr. Vorontsov served as second secretary in the Russian Federation's Embassy in Pyongyang from 2000 to 2002. He holds a Ph.D. in history from the Institute of Oriental Studies at the U.S.S.R. Academy of Sciences. He was the member of the Russian part of the Russia-DPRK, Russia-ROK Intergovernmental Commission dealing with trade-economic and scientific-technical cooperation. Dr. Vorontsov has studied at Lomonosov Moscow State University and Pyongyang Kim II Sung University.
